With its ellipsoidal silhouette and name that sounds as if it comes from a science-fiction saga, already a declaration of intent, the O-Space hanging lamp allows the passage of light through two oblong cuts on its two opposite faces. On the upper and lower parts, two less visible holes create conical beams of light, emphasizing the moonlike appearance of the object. The body is made of high-density polyurethane foam, a material as common in other sectors of design as it is unusual in that of lighting: normally used for the frames of seats, television sets or PCs, it allows the production of large volumes while maintaining the necessary lightness.
